ELIGIBILITY

Permission of instructor(s) is required.

- Priority will be given to pre-health profession majors and Junior or Senior status
- Current WKU student eligible to register for WKU courses may apply. Students from outside WKU may participate as non-degree seeking student.
- Students must be 18 years of age or older at time of departure (parent/guardian permission for anyone under 18 at time of departure).
- Students must possess passport valid for at least six (6) months after return date.
- Students must be free of active disciplinary sanctions as verified by Judicial Affairs.
- Students must complete all pre-departure orientations.
- Full payment prior to departure is required.
- Students must complete the <u>Study Abroad & Global Learning application process</u> prior to being registered in this
 course. We suggest you start this application process immediately and respond to all emails promptly

BASE PACKAGE

Estimated Cost: \$4100 - \$4200

Included in Base Package

- Undergraduate tuition waived for 3 credit hours
- All lodging accommodations during program in Kenya
- Entrance fees for all program related excursions
- Majority of meals included in Kenya
- Course-related ground transportation
- International medical insurance

Excluded from Base Package

- Fall undergraduate tuition for 1 credit hours (class will be assessed as part of your Fall tuition and fees)
- Roundtrip airfare from home airport to Nairobi, Kenya (however, WKU can assist in booking flights)
- Transportation between your departure airport and your home.
- Independent travel (non-program travel).
- > Travel cancellation/interruption insurance. Highly recommended.
- Meals, services, and beverages not mentioned in the program, see syllabus
- Baggage fees and costs associated with flight / program changes at student request
- Vaccinations
- VISA to travel to Kenya (approximate cost \$50 \$100)
- SAGL Study Abroad Application fee of \$150.00

TERMS & CONDITIONS

Your TopNet Account will be billed according to the following Payment Schedule:

October 1 – General application and deposit deadline*. Program fee balance will be billed to TopNet and must be paid prior to program departure.

*\$250 deposit is paid by student directly with a credit card via TopNet and not billed to student account.

Penalty for Withdrawal or Non-payment: \$250 Non-refundable Deposit

After September 1: 25% of program cost After October 1: 50% of program cost After November 1: 75% of program cost After December 1: 100% (No refund)

If a balance remains after the payment due date, the participant may be dropped from the program. A student may remain in the program by providing an award notification from WKU's Student Financial Assistance that verifies ability to pay the program fee immediately after aid is received.

The total amount due in your semester invoice may reflect the combined charges for multiple terms (i.e. Fall and Winter or Spring and Summer) and includes program fees for your Faculty-Led Study Abroad program. - Passport Requirements Each participant must have a passport that includes an expiration date, which is 6 months beyond the last date of the program and 2 empty pages
- Potential participants must compete an additional application separate from the standard WKU Study Abroad Application
- Students will need to purchase a visa in order to travel to Kenya as part of the course. Dr. Nancy Rice will work with students approved to participate in the program to obtain the visa.
