### PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

Morocco is a great location to learn about the diversity of the Middle East and North Africa (MENA) region. It has been influenced by several European powers (Spain, France and Portugal), it is a North African state of the Maghreb, which has been the home of several medieval Islamic dynasties, it is a monarchy that while affected by the Arab spring has found ways to politically and socially adapt to the forces of modernization, political Islam and globalization. WKU students will be introduced to a geostrategically important state and region and will experience Arabic and North African culture and languages. Interactive learning with local public officials, students and educators, and focused excursions help enhance the program.

- Define key individuals, institutions and regional and global processes affecting the states of the Middle East and North Africa (MENA).
- Conduct basic comparative research, identifying internal and external independent and dependent variables as related to MENA politics utilizing relevant theory and concepts.
- Analyze the interconnectedness of domestic, regional and international processes, conditions, norms and institutions affecting MENA states and societies at both the micro and macro levels.
- Describe the effects of global processes including economic integration, transcultural diffusion, liberalization, and democratization on MENA state institutions and societies.

# PS 407: Directed Studies in PS

- Students will understand the core concepts, themes, methodology and theories of the discipline/subfield.
- Students will demonstrate critical thinking in analyzing contemporary phenomena.
- Students will demonstrate in-depth knowledge and understanding of at least one area of interest.

# PS 450: Islam and Politics

- Identify the key issues confronting Muslim populations in different regions of the world, in particular North Africa
- Describe how Muslims identify themselves and their relations with their states and societies (in select majorityand minority-population Muslim countries), Morocco will serve as a critical case study
- Explain how various forms of identity affect political mobilization
- Explain the different strategies that states have taken in regards to diverse communities



 Describe how identity and politics are socially constructed via texts and images in the popular press, TV, cinema and popular culture

- Students must be free of active disciplinary sanctions as verified by the Office of Student Conduct.
  - Students who become ineligible to attend the program after applying due to disciplinary sanctions will be subject to standard program cost penalty rates. Students are responsible for notifying the Office of Global Learning & International Affairs when they become aware of this ineligibility.
- Students must complete all pre-departure orientations.
- Full payment is due prior to date of departure.

### **LOGISTICAL REQUIREMENTS & CONSIDERATIONS**

- Travel ID Requirements Each participant must have a passport that includes an expiration date which is 6 months beyond the last date of the program. Please begin application process no later than 4 months prior to departure. / Each participant must have a valid ID for air travel within the United States prior to program departure.
- COVID-19 Social Distancing Requirements-
  - Participants should expect social distancing measures and regulations, including the wearing of masks, to be in place for the duration of their program. All participants must follow social distancing regulations put into place by the program, host locations, and/or airports/airlines.
  - It is highly encouraged for all program participants to practice social distancing measures for at least a week prior to program departure to limit the risk of being exposed to COVID-19. This includes wearing masks and where possible, staying at home.
- Physical Considerations- By embarking on this study abroad program, you may be required to participate in various activities such as but not limited to-- hikes, camel rides, desert walks, overnight stays in the desert, mule treks, a surf class and travel by land, air and sea. While we will be in an air-conditioned mini-bus for most of the ground travel, some of our accommodations may not have air conditioning. Temperatures vary but can exceed 90 degrees Fahrenheit. The physical activity on this trip can be characterized as moderate-heavy. All trip and program activities that are required must be completed during the trip.

# **Deposit Non-Refundable**

If a balance remains after the payment due date, a transcript and registration hold will be placed on the student's account by the WKU Bursar's Office.

Withdrawal Process: The student must inform Global Learning & International Affairs directly and in writing (email accepted, study.abroad@wku.edu) if he or she chooses to withdraw from a program. No other statements of withdrawal will be considered as notification of withdrawal, therefore, the student will still be considered a program participant until this written notification is received. Withdrawal penalties will be based on the notification date as listed in the Payment Terms and Conditions section of this Participation Contract (see above) and are in effect regardless of when program deposit is paid.

**Program Cost Invoicing:** Your program balance will be invoiced to your TopNet account for the term in which the program takes place. When making payments for your program balance, please let the WKU Cashier's Office know that your payment is for your faculty-led program balance. The total amount due in your semester bill may reflect the combined charges for multiple terms (i.e. Fall and Winter or Spring and Summer) and includes program fees for your Faculty-Led program.
