PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

The course is an on-campus and seventeen-day travel abroad course involving a trip to The Netherlands, Germany and France with mandatory pre- and post-travel class meetings regarding the course subjects. An attempt is made to integrate historical, social, economic, environmental and animal welfare issues as a comparative study of agronomy, horticulture, plant production and utilization, and animal science in Europe and the United States. Various marketing and production sites will be visited. Emphasis will be on innovations on crop and livestock production/ animal products, as well as traditional methods of European agriculture. Further emphasis is placed on issues as a comparative study of leadership development and practice in Europe and the United States.

Horticulture specific Objectives:

- Compare agricultural variables between Europe and the US
- Develop an appreciation for horticultural preservation as it is practiced in Europe
- Determine the practices and problems of plant and animal production in Europe versus the US
- Distinguish between the value of plants grown in Europe as a raw crop and as value-added products; compare to the products of KY
- Describe the approach to landscapes and the variety of gardens seen in Europe
- Experience living in another culture
- Adapt knowledge learned to further success in your field of study

Animal Science specific Objectives:

- Apply animal science terminology.
- Compare and contrast EU/US livestock production and industry, including animal products.
- Compare and contrast EU/US livestock management practices including welfare aspects

Leadership specific Objectives:

• Students, at the conclusion of this course, will gain knowledge of leadership concepts, leadership theory, an understanding of leadership assessment, and will better understand their own leadership skills and abilities.



- Identify behaviors of effective leaders.
- Gain an understanding of applying leadership aspects to various situations and contexts
- Gain an overview of tools available for measuring and improving leadership effectiveness

- Undergraduate students with 3.2 cumulative GPA, good standing in the Honors College, or permission of the instructor.
