



Journalism in Spain

Journalism students will examine special topics regarding the Economic Crisis in Spain while developing their language skills in Spanish earning 6 hours of credit during the four week program in Salamanca, Spain.

COURSES

Students will earn 6 credit hours by combining the Journalism course with one of two Spanish courses:

JOUR 481 (3 credits): Special Topics Multimedia Reporting

-AND-

SPAN 102 (3 credits): Elementary Spanish II

-OR-

SPAN 306 (3 credits): Experiencing Spanish Abroad

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

This program explores lessons in journalism in addition to developing skills with the Spanish language. The JOUR 481 course will be taught concurrently with SPAN102 or SPAN 306 allowing you to work immersed in Salamanca, Spain putting to practice the language and reporting skills you have acquired up to this point in a variety of mediums.

The final goal of this course is to produce and publish a multi-platformed-based team project on issues related to the current economic crisis in Spain. We will work as a team, which will both allow students to bring their strengths and expertise to the table, while simultaneously requiring each student to dive into a realm of journalism in which they are not as familiar or comfortable. The project will use the latest technology available to multimedia journalists to tell the stories of the people who allow us to tell their powerful stories.

LEARNING OBJECTIVES

Story Research – Determine as a class the focus and direction of our project and identify stories that we will report and edit while in Spain. Students will be expected to go beyond what has been already reported, to find stories that represent how Spain's diverse population and experience is affected by the crisis.

- Language Use Students will use Spanish language in the field in reporting and editing, and will be expected to produce the site in Spanish and English.
- Website Define and outline the goals of the website. For whom are we reporting and how will we delivery those stories.
- Mediums Based on experience, interest and story topic, determine in what medium we will report each story.
 Each student will be not only encouraged, but expected to improve their skills in areas that they are not as proficient.
- Deadlines Like other journalism courses, we will set and hold to our agreed upon deadlines to complete the project on time.



Teamwork – Each member of the team will be expected to work closely with other team members to produce
projects collaboratively, either through medium or within mediums. Brand and distribute the project to a wide
audience, both in Spain and abroad.

ELIGIBILITY

- Graduate student in good standing (Graduate Catalog p.30).
- Permission of instructor(s) is required.
- Current WKU student eligible to register for WKU courses may apply. Students from outside WKU may participate as visiting students.
- Students must be 18 years of age or older at time of departure (parent/guardian permission for anyone under 18 at time of departure).
- Students must possess passport valid for at least six (6) months after return date.
- Students must be free of active disciplinary sanctions as verified by Judicial Affairs.
- Students must complete all pre-departure orientations.
- Full payment prior to departure is required.
- Students must complete the <u>Study Abroad & Global Learning application process</u> prior to being registered in this
 course. We suggest you start this application process immediately and respond to all emails promptly

BASE PACKAGE

Estimated Cost: \$4,300

Included in Base Package

- Undergraduate tuition for 6 credit hours (\$2,180 value)
- Homestay costs during program in Spain

Excluded from Base Package

- Roundtrip airfare to/from home country and Spain not included
- Transportation between your departure airport and your home.
- Independent travel (non-program travel).
- Meals, services, and beverages not included during course-related field programs.
- Personal expenses such as laundry, phone service, and Internet access.
- Tips for guides and drivers not included in program-related activity.
- Travel cancellation/interruption insurance. Highly recommended.

TERMS & CONDITIONS

Your TopNet Account will be billed according to the following Payment Schedule:

February 1, 2014 – Program Fee will be charged to student's TopNet account. Balance must be paid prior to program departure. Students applying after this date will be billed on a rolling basis.

* Deposit paid by student directly with a credit card – NOT billed to student account.

Penalty for Withdrawal or Non-payment:

After February 1: 25% of program cost After March 1: 50% of program cost After April 1: 75% of program cost

After May 1: 100% of program cost (No refund).

If a balance remains after the payment due date, the participant may be dropped from the program. A student may remain in the program by providing an award notification from WKU's Student Financial Assistance that verifies ability to pay the program fee immediately after aid is received.
