PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

This Study Abroad offers opportunity for both graduate and undergraduate students to learn the role of culture and context in the communication behaviors of leaders from a non-US culture. The students and faculty will spend two weeks in England, and students will work with WKU faculty and British lecturers-teachers who have expertise in relating the speech or message of British leaders to the culture and locations we visit. The relatively short trip will permit fascinating views of famous places and related rhetorical artifacts and help students to understand how leaders from different cultures communicate with their followers.

LEARNING OBJECTIVES

- To enhance critical evaluation of historic and contemporary leadership rhetoric
- To recognize varied leadership styles related to cultural factors and contexts
- To recognize the roles of culture, context, and social circumstances in shaping leadership styles and leaders' rhetoric in Britain
- To enhance written and oral communication skills appropriate for an educated person
