PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

In this course, students will be introduced to the educational system in the United Kingdom in a comparative study with education in the United States. Using the "City as Text" model, students will explore the communities of York and London to map, observe, and reflect on stakeholder partnerships and resources supporting teaching and learning to understand the dynamics of place and community in an international setting. Students will visit two primary and two secondary schools in the UK to observe instructional strategies, behavior management techniques, and teacher leadership roles. Field experiences in local schools will allow students the opportunity to study educational leadership within an international setting.

This collaborative course is designed for Master's level students in Teacher Leadership and Doctoral students in Educational Leadership. These programs seek to prepare students to be productive, engaged, and socially responsible citizen leaders of a global society. This course will provide students an opportunity to include an international aspect in their program of study and the opportunity to meet with international leaders and work in international communities.

PROGRAM LEARNING OBJECTIVES

- Explore, analyze, apply, and evaluate research-based best instructional strategies for diverse P-12 classroom.
- Evaluate the influence of individual differences on the teaching and learning process in the P12 classroom.
- Examine the role of school and stakeholder partnerships (both at school and district levels) in P-12 student achievement.
- Experience practical and in-depth investigations studying educational leadership within an international setting.
- Collaborate with international communities and agencies with issues in education.
- Employ experiential learning as a means of understanding the dynamics of place and community in an international setting.

ELIGIBILITY

- Permission of instructor(s) is required.
- Student must be in good academic standing.
- Student must have a minimum GPA of 2.0.
- Current WKU students eligible to register for WKU courses may apply. Students from outside WKU may participate as visiting students.
- Students must be 18 years of age or older at time of departure.
- Students must possess a passport valid for at least six (6) months after return date.
- Students must be free of active disciplinary sanctions as verified by the Office of Student Conduct.
 - Students who become ineligible to attend the program after applying due to disciplinary sanctions will be subject to standard program cost penalty rates. Students are responsible for notifying the Office of Study Abroad & Global Learning when they become aware of this ineligibility.
- Students must complete all pre-departure orientations.
- Full payment is due prior to date of departure.
- Students must complete the <u>Study Abroad & Global Learning application process</u> prior to being registered in this course. We suggest you start this application process immediately and respond to all emails promptly





By applying, you also acknowledge that the full cost is due before the program departure date, and you are reminded and encouraged to complete the FAFSA even if you have not received financial aid in the past.

If a student completes a program without full payment prior to the departure, the student should receive an incomplete until the obligation is paid. The Office of Study Abroad & Global Learning will inform faculty leaders if a student is in this situation prior to the term grade deadline.

LOGISTICAL CONSIDERATIONS

- Passport Requirements Each participant must have a passport that includes an expiration date which is 6 months beyond the last date of the program. Please begin application process no later than 4 months prior to departure.
- Visitors During the study abroad in-country, students will be busy and occupied with required activities and assignments. There will be very little, if any, extra time to entertain guests and visitors. In addition, Harlaxton College requires visitors to pay the same fees as participating students. The course instructors recommend that students refrain from inviting guests until after the program has ended.
- Student Disability Services In compliance with university policy, students with disabilities who require accommodations (academic adjustments and/or auxiliary aids or services) for this course must contact the Student Accommodations Resource Center (SARC) on the first floor of Downing Student Union. • Physical Requirements - There will be a large amount of walking on this study abroad program. Participants need to be prepared to walk several miles a day. In Harlaxton Manor, participants will need to climb several flights of stairs to the rooms. Participants will need to be able to carry their own luggage and maneuver with luggage onto the train and the subway.

TERMS AND CONDITIONS

The student **must inform the Office of Study Abroad and Global Learning directly and in writing** (email accepted) if he or she chooses to withdraw from a program. No other statements of withdrawal will be considered as notification of withdrawal, therefore, the student will still be considered a program participant until this written notification is received. Withdrawal penalties will be based on the notification date as listed in the Terms and Conditions section of the Participation Contract.

Your TopNet Account will be billed according to the following Payment Schedule:

(Summer) February 1, 2020 – Priority Deadline. Program Fee will be charged to student's TopNet account (minus \$250 non-refundable deposit). Balance must be paid prior to program departure. Students applying after this date will be billed on a rolling basis.

* Deposit paid by student directly with a credit card – NOT billed to student account.

Penalty for Withdrawal or Non-payment:

After May 1: 100% of program cost billable to student/(No refund)

If a balance remains after the payment due date, the participant may be dropped from the program. A student may remain in the program by providing an award notification from WKU's Student Financial Assistance that verifies ability to pay the program fee immediately after aid is received.

The total amount due in your semester invoice may reflect the combined charges for multiple terms (i.e. Fall and Winter or Spring and Summer) and includes program fees for your Faculty-Led program.
