PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

This program is a study in the economic history and modern economy of the EU and northern Europe. The courses are an instruction and tour program that studies production and allocation of resources, past and present, in Scandinavia and German/Austria. The program centers on business and economic development and looks at the organizational frameworks related to resource allocation in Europe, the role of the international economy, and the importance of cultural differences in business development and practices.

LEARNING OBJECTIVES

Students completing the course will:

- Have a heightened awareness of markets and how they work
- Better understand social legislation in the economic markets
- Better understand how cultural difference affect international business
- Have a better understanding of the EU and how common currency and the free flow of labor affects the economies of Europe and the individual member countries.

ELIGIBILITY

Student Eligibility - Program leaders may determine stricter eligibility requirements, but at a minimum, all applicants earning credit in a program would meet these requirements:

- Current WKU student eligible to enroll in WKU courses OR students from outside WKU may participate as non-degree seeking student,
- Good academic standing as defined in the Undergraduate Catalog or Graduate Catalog,
- For those younger than 18 at time of departure: Must be registered in a WKU course for credit. Must be a part of an established WKU program, and No guarantee of acceptance due to different program design and location.
- No current disciplinary sanctions as verified by the WKU Office of Student Conduct
 - Students who become ineligible to attend the program after applying due to disciplinary sanctions will be subject to standard program cost penalty rates. Students are responsible for notifying the Office of Study Away when they become aware of this ineligibility. For eligibility questions pertaining to disciplinary sanctions, students should contact the WKU Office of Student Conduct.
- Students must complete <u>Study Abroad & Global Learning application process</u> prior to being registered in this course. All students studying abroad are required to pay \$150 application fee.
- Students must select program on TopNet and pay \$250 deposit to finalize admittance process,
- Student must possess passport book valid for a least six (6) months after return date.





- Students must complete pre-departure orientations,
- Full payment prior to departure, and
- Permission of instructor(s) is required.

If a student completes a program without full payment prior to the departure, the student should receive an incomplete until the obligation is paid. Office of Study Away will inform faculty leaders if a student is in this situation prior to the Study Away term grade deadline.

TERMS & CONDITIONS

The <u>student must inform Study Away directly and in writing</u> (email accepted) if he or she chooses to withdraw from a program. No other statements of withdrawal will be considered as notification of withdrawal, therefore, the student will still be considered a program participant until this written notification is received. Penalties will be based on the notification date as listed in the Terms and Conditions section of the program details below.

Your TopNet Account will be billed according to the following Payment Schedule:

February 1 – Program Fee will be charged to student's TopNet account (minus \$250 non-refundable deposit). Balance must be paid prior to program departure. Students applying after this date will be billed on a rolling basis.

* Deposit paid by student directly with a credit card – NOT billed to student account.

Penalty for Withdrawal or Non-payment:

After February 1: 25% of program cost billable to student After March 1: 50% of program cost billable to student After April 1: 75% of program cost billable to student After May 1: 100% of program cost billable to student (No refund)

If a balance remains after the payment due date, the participant may be dropped from the program. A student may remain in the program by providing an award notification from WKU's Student Financial Assistance that verifies ability to pay the program fee immediately after aid is received.

The total amount due in your semester invoice may reflect the combined charges for multiple terms (i.e. Fall and Winter or Spring and Summer) and includes program fees for your Study Away program. - **Passport Requirements** Each participant must have a passport that includes an expiration date, which is 6 months beyond the last date of the program.

- **Physical Requirements** There will be a large amount of walking on this study abroad program. Participants need to be prepared to walk several miles a day.
